Pool Safety

An estimated 260 children under the age of five drown each year in residential swimming pools. The Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) recommends to: Never leave children unattended for ANY reason; never rely on swimming lessons or flotation devices; never leave steps or ladders that allow access to above-ground pools when unsupervised; never swim with the pool cover partially in place; never swim when the drain cover is broken or missing; lastly, never allow access to an unsupervised pool.
