



BRUSHY CREEK MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

- Home to over 22,000 residents over 4 square miles (2300 acres)
- Established in 1977, 45 years old
- Public Works: TCEQ Superior Rated water treatment and water delivery, wastewater conveyance, and Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4); over 140 miles of line
- Parks and Recreation: 11 parks, 6 miles of trails, 4 pools, 2 tennis courts, 65,000 sq ft Community Center, greenbelts, 32 Karst Caves, and an 18-hole disc golf course
- Employees: 60 Full time, Over 30 Part-time, and Over 60 Seasonal





FY22 Budget


- + Employer Cost of healthcare: **SHRM 5%**




PPI Commodity data for Machinery and equipment

FY22 Budget










