




FY 2018 General Fund – Sources of Funding












Total Tax

Area




Revenues - Tax Rates








Comparison of Local Utility Rates








TOTAL ANNUAL FEES and CHARGES





Expenses – Utility Rates



- Non-capital operating costs for water treatment and distribution increased by 16% from 2008 to 2017 (\$1.83 million to \$2.114 million)
- Of that \$285,000 increase, \$272,000 was for raw water contract and utilities.

Cost Saving Measures

- Reduced water loss from 28% to 7%
- Aggressive bidding, i.e. chemical cost in 2008 was \$197,000. In 2018 budget, \$90,000.
- Sold Brushy Bend System
- Internal borrowing for Brushy Creek North waterline project saved over \$1.5 million in interest costs
- Added ground water
- Funding Capital and one-off expenses with reserves
- Better maintained system reduces deferred maintenance or capital costs
- Using impact fees to supplement revenues

Expenses – Utility Rates



- In financial model, non-capital costs for water treatment and distribution will increase by 4.5% through 2021
- Impact fee revenue is reduced to \$0
- No new customers District has reached build out
- Source of revenues is in rates
- Rate Study indicated expenses could support 10% increase in Water rates
- Wastewater Rates were supporting expenses
- Board of Director's Goals
 - Use other funds to lessen the impact and spread any increase over several years
 - Based on current information, the new rates plus other funds should support expenses for the next 7 to 10 years
